The summer was busy on campus with orientations, and summer classes for nursing and sonography students. We also had the opportunity to host many summer events. On Monday, June 19, we held the 17th annual golf classic at Oneida Golf and Country Club. The event was able to raise over \$60,000 to help support the Hands on Healthcare initiative and take it on the road with the new ambulance. For those of you not familiar with Hands on Healthcare, it is an initiative we started in 2015 to expose high school students to careers in healthcare. Students spend the day rotating through stations in the Health Sciences Resource Center (HSRC) practicing skills and techniques guided by Bellin College students, faculty and healthcare professionals. Accommodation Services

Library Update: New Search Feature Available

Are you unsure as to where to begin your research? Do you need resources readily available through the library? If so, the **Discovery Search tab** may be your answer. The Discovery Search (aka the EBSCO Discovery Service $^{\text{TM}}$) is a tool that allows you to search for books, articles, and videos using a single search box.

The Discovery Search option does not search every resource the library has to offer. It is recommended to search an individual database if you need to do a comprehensive literature search or if you would like to take advantage of a database's unique search features.

Mental Health Survey Results

Mental health continues to be a hot topic across college campuses. Mental health problems in the college student population can be seen in its effect on academic performance, retention, and graduation rates. In the spring of 2017, a mental health survey was sent out to all students. The goal in surveying our student population was to gain a better understanding of our students and their concerns. Students responded that at times they may have experienced problems related to depression, anxiety, "binge" drinking, and/or relationship issues.

A total of 188 students responded to the survey (132 were traditional undergraduate students, 32 were 15 Month students, 12 were RN to BSN students, and 12 were graduate level students).

- 86% of the students felt nervous, anxious, or on edge.
- 69% were not able to stop or control worrying.
- 45% reported little interest or pleasure in doing things.
- 46% felt down, depressed, or hopeless.
- 4% of students reported having close friends or relatives that worry or complain about their drinking or use of drugs.
- 50% of the males and 23% of the females report having 5 or more drinks in one day; 10 or more times this past year. Potentially, "binge" drinking 1X/month.

In response to these findings, the Task Force will be developing programming that will enhance student mental health and well being.


Health Sciences Resource Center (HSRC)

The HSRC is starting a "scheduling" option for 1:1 or small group skillstutoring sessions. There will also be group study hours closer to check off and testing times.


HOW TO SCHEDULE A 1:1 SKILLS TUTORING SESSION

Step 1: Sign on to canvas using your login and password.


Step 2: Click on **Calendar** located on the left side of the screen as shown:




Step 3: Click on Scheduler on the top right corner of the page as shown:

Bellin College uses standardized tests to help students identify areas of strength and areas for improvement. Exam notifications are listed on the timetables, sent through Outlook and are provided in the table to the right. Please confirm these dates and times on your calendar.

Students with approved testing accommodations will test in the library and are sent their specific testing times via email. If you do not have notice of a test listed, please let me know. It is expected that students test at the scheduled time. Should an emergency arise, please notify Mary Rolloff as soon as possible.

It is well documented that students learn a great deal by reviewing the content related to each question. BSRS students can only review the exams immediately following the test. Extra time is built into the testing session especially for review and remediation. The nursing exams are designed to be reviewed anytime after testing is completed.

No matter where you are in the curriculum, it is not too late to take advantage of these resources. Your success is our goal, and working together we can achieve greatness!


Senior Cash Bash

Reminders for Student Receiving Financial Aid through Bellin College:

If you have not yet accepted your federal student loans for this academic year, please be sure to access your MyBC portal to either accept or decline your loans.

If you will be seeking additional financing options such as private loans or Federal PLUS loans (for parents), now is the time to begin the application process. For more information on private education loans, see the FastChoice website (https://choice.fastproducts.org/FastChoice/home/663900): Review lenders, terms, and compare rates and benefits.

If your parent wishes to apply for a Federal PLUS Loan, the parent borrower must complete a PLUS Loan Request form (please contact the financial aid office for form and more details).

If you or your parent are a new borrower, you must complete both an entrance counseling session and a loan agreement (master promissory note—MPN) at www.studentloans.gov before a loan can be processed.

Reminders for ALL Students:

If you have concerns regarding your financing options for this academic year, please see either Lena or Mary Jo in the One Stop Shop.

Even though the 2017-2018 academic year is just now underway, it will soon be time to start thinking about the next year's (2018-2019) FAFSA. The 2018-2019 FAFSA will be available October 1, 2017; it will use your (and your parents', if you are a dependent student) 2016 federal income tax data (no need to wait until taxes are completed since your 2016 taxes would have been filed this past April).



Bellin College Financial Literacy Scholarship for Spring 2018 Could you use \$500 to help pay your Spring 2018 tuition and fees?

One \$500 Scholarship will be awarded for the Spring 2018 semester. Selection will be made via random drawing from among all GradReady student users who complete at least one Money Skills quiz during the Qualification Period. NOTE: To qualify, student must be currently enrolled as a degree-seeking student at Bellin College during the qualification period.

GradReady is a web-based financial literacy site offered to all students by Bellin College. Students may set up a secure account at https://bellincollege.gradready.com; access is free.

How to Qualify:

Step 1: Access GradReady. If you do not already have an account, you will need to create a user ID and password. If creating a new account, you will be asked to select a 'Path' to start out with and will be presented with a Pre-Course Questionnaire; you are required to complete the questionnaire in order to complete the registration. You may move between Paths, but you must complete the Pre-Course Questionnaire for each Path to unlock it. Completing a Pre-Course Questionnaire does not qualify a student for the scholarship drawing.

Step 2: Under Money Skills, click *View More*. Select a topic. You will be presented with three optional short informative videos. In the right margin you will see a button to 'Take Quiz'. The videos may help you to improve your score on the quiz but watching the videos is not required in order to take the quiz.

Step 3: Take the Quiz. Most quizzes have only 7 to 10 questions. If you score lower than you expected, you may want to review the information on that topic (videos and the Helpful Resources) and retake the quiz. You must score higher than 0% to qualify for scholarship entry.

Completing at least one quiz within the qualification period will ensure you are registered for our scholarship drawing. Yes, it's that easy! Have fun exploring other topics in GradReady, too!

Emergency Procedures & Campus Safety

Inclement Weather/Class Cancellations: If the hours of operation of the College are altered (cancellation of classes, labs, and/or practicum) there will be an announcement sent to all students via phone call, email, and/or text message with the details of the delay/closure. These messages will be sent by the College's notification system School Messenger. The Bellin College website and/or local radio and televisions stations will also be notified of delay/closure. Students are responsible for using personal judgment regarding their safety and travel to the College during inclement weather. If the College closes for reasons other than weather, check the website.
