The Bellin College **Developing Academic Skills and Habits (DASH) Program** provides academic support to students who do not meet the admissions requirements for our direct admit option\*. The goal of the program is to help students achieve the standards needed to enroll in the Sophomore Transfer Option (STO) their second year.

If students achieve at least a cumulative 3.0 G.P.A. in their first two semesters, they may apply as a BSN STO or a BSRS STO and join that cohort. The Student Success and Introduction to Health Sciences courses are Pass/Fail and would make up three General Education credits in total. Applicants must have completed all required high school courses to be eligible.

- English (4)
- Social Science (3)
- Algebra (1)
- Advanced Math (2)
- Biology (1)
- Chemistry (1)
- Advanced Science (1)

**\*Direct admit requirements (does not apply to DASH Program admits):**

**Nursing:** 3.25 cumulative GPA and a ACT composite score of 23

**Radiologic Sciences:** 3.0 cumulative GPA and a ACT composite score of 20
