## Transfer and GED Students

### Transfer Students and Students with a GED

(Transfer options include: traditional four-year, sophomore, junior and 15-month)



Bellin College offers scholarships to undergraduate students with high academic achievements at the time of admission. Merit scholarships are based solely on academic performance and are to be used to pay for educational costs incurred while enrolled at Bellin College. Awards will be distributed over a student's entire enrollment at Bellin College and based upon the following scales\*:

Transfer Students or Students with a GED		
GPA or GED Total Score	Level	Total Award
3.50-3.74 or 2750-2999	<b>Martensen Award</b>	\$10,000
3.75-3.94 or 3000-3499	<b>Krueger Award</b>	\$15,000
3.95-4.00 or 3500-4000	<b>Giese Award</b>	\$26,000

*\*Award amounts effective after July 1, 2019*

### Additional Information:

- Only students identified as accepted applicants will be reviewed for merit scholarship eligibility.
- For transfer students: Eligibility will be based upon the student's transfer credits and transfer GPA.
  - Transfer credits are those credits/courses which are required in the BC curriculum and are accepted for transfer into the Bellin College program.
  - Transfer GPA is defined as the calculated GPA on all accepted transfer credits/courses at the time of admission into the Bellin College program. Grades from non-transferable courses are not included in the transfer GPA.
- For GED students: Students who are accepted with GED scores instead of high school diplomas will be evaluated for merit scholarship eligibility based on the scores provided to Bellin College.
- Merit scholarship eligibility is based upon the transcripts on file at the time of the official review, and is not amended based on subsequent transcripts received.
- In order to retain eligibility for the merit scholarship, the cumulative Bellin College GPA must be a minimum of 3.50.
