Step 1: Fill out your FAFSA!

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) must be filled out each year to apply for financial aid and many scholarships. **Bellin College school code: 0006639**

KEY DATES: **October 1** – FAFSA is available
December 1 – Bellin College priority filling date

Step 2: Fill out a Scholarship Application

Scholarships are gifts that do not have to be repaid.

The Bellin College donor scholarship application is open mid-December through mid-March. Watch your email for more information!

Presidential Scholarship - The Presidential Scholarship is awarded annually to eligible scholarship applicants currently enrolled or who will be enrolled in the upcoming fall semester at Bellin College in an undergraduate degree program. Scholarship award amounts are based on candidate's ability to meet the eligibility requirements.

Bellin College Scholarships - Bellin College provides multiple scholarship opportunities which include admissions, merit and donor scholarships. Each scholarship type has various requirements, however, candidates will be evaluated based on a combination of the following criteria: financial need, extracurricular and/or leadership activities, academic success, personal statement, and essay answers. Donor scholarship award amounts may vary year to year dependent upon available funds.
