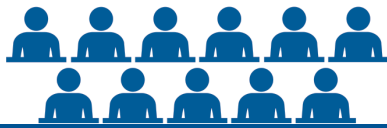

Ways to achieve a BSN degree at Bellin College:

- **Traditional Option** — Designed for students who have or will have a high school diploma at the time of enrollment. Traditional students begin as freshmen and complete the BSN degree in four years. Nursing courses are taken concurrently with general education courses starting with the first semester of enrollment.
- **Sophomore Transfer Option** — Designed for students with sophomore standing who have completed specific general education requirements. Students accepted into this option will be required to complete two freshmen-level online courses during the summer semester, and will then join the sophomore class at the beginning of the fall semester — enabling students to complete the BSN degree in three years.

- **Junior Transfer Option** — Designed for students who have completed the majority of the 56 Bellin College required general education credits. Additional general education courses may be completed during program of study if needed. Students accepted into this option will be required to complete two sophomore-level online courses during the summer semester, and will then join the junior class at the beginning of the fall semester — enabling students to complete the BSN degree in two years. No prior degree is required.
- **15-Month Option** — Designed for students who have completed the 56 transferable, program required general education credits. Students complete their BSN degree in 15 academic months. No prior degree is required.

Bachelor of Science in Radiologic Sciences (BSRS) degree

The radiologic technologist is an essential member of the healthcare team, dedicated to preserving patient health by helping diagnose injury and disease through the use of medical imaging. The Bachelor of Science in Radiologic Sciences (BSRS) program will provide you with excellent academic and clinical experience in general radiography and Computed Tomography (CT) scanning. Additionally, students will have a choice in one of the following: Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) scanning or women's imaging including: mammography and DXA (osteoporosis detection) scanning.



Program Specialties

The radiologic sciences program focuses on the following areas of specialty:

Women's Imaging

Mammograms are X-ray images of the breast used to screen for breast cancer. Mammograms play a key role in early breast cancer detection and help decrease breast cancer deaths.

CT Scanning (Computed Tomography)

CT technology uses X-rays and computers to produce very detailed images of patient anatomy. The technologist operates the equipment and computers to create 3-D images of patients and their medical condition.

MRI (Magnetic Resonance Imaging)

Used as a diagnostic tool by physicians, MRI uses magnetic fields and radio waves to diagnose diseases. The MRI technologist operates the scanners to produce images and provide patient care during the study.

Ways to achieve a BSRS degree at Bellin College:

- **Traditional Option** — Students begin as freshmen and complete the BSRS degree in four years. Radiology courses are taken concurrently with general education courses starting with the first semester of enrollment.
- **Sophomore Transfer Option** — Designed for students with sophomore standing who have completed specific general education requirements. Students accepted into this option will be required to complete two freshmen-level online courses during the summer semester, and will then join the sophomore class at the beginning of the fall semester — enabling students to complete the BSRS degree in three years. *Enrollment for this option is limited.*

Bachelor of Science in Diagnostic Medical Sonography (BSDMS) degree

The diagnostic medical sonographer is an essential member of the healthcare team. They use high-tech instruments to create and interpret injury and disease processes in organs, blood vessels, and tissues. The images created through the use of high-frequency sound waves are used by physicians to make a medical diagnosis.

Bellin College's Diagnostic Medical Sonography (BSDMS) program is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission (HLC) and will provide excellent opportunities, resources, and state-of-the-art facilities for students—including a fully operational sonography lab. Students will gain clinical, educational, and laboratory training that will help provide the skills needed to be confident in their career.

Our fully-accredited program will provide you with excellent opportunities, resources and state-of-the-art facilities to excel your academic and clinical experience. A three-year program designed with an emphasis on leadership and management, leading to a Bachelor of Science in Diagnostic Medical Sonography.

Diagnostic Medical Sonography Program

Get your bachelor's Degree in just three years!

- **Three-year program**

Full-time bachelor's program (three-semester academic year) with 1,300 scheduled clinical hours.

Program Specialties

The diagnostic medical sonography program focuses on the following areas of specialty:

Abdomen

Sonographers certified in **Abdomen** will have the knowledge, skills, and abilities to scan organs, blood vessels and soft tissues of the abdominal cavities and glands of the neck.

OB/ Gynecological

Sonographers certified in **OB/GYN** will have the knowledge, skills and abilities to scan the female reproductive system and fetus in the first, second, and third trimesters of pregnancy.

Vascular

Sonographers certified in **Vascular** will have the knowledge, skills, and abilities with regards to anatomy and hemodynamics to scan venous, peripheral, cerebrovascular, arterial, and abdominal blood vessels.



Diagnostic Cardiac Sonography Certificate

The Diagnostic Cardiac Sonography Certificate program (DCS) is a fast-track adult echocardiography program



designed for working sonographers registered in vascular technology (RVT) through the American Registry of Diagnostic Medical Sonography (ARDMS). This two-semester program teaches all didactic courses online with one mandatory weekend clinical intensive (in-person) requirement

in the Fall semester. Clinical requirements of 450 hours are met at the sonographer's current employer or with placement assistance from Bellin College faculty.

Program outcome

To prepare competent entry-level adult cardiac sonographers in the cognitive (knowledge), psychomotor (skills), and affective (behavior) learning domains.

Requirements for admission

Credentialed in vascular technology (RVT) through the American Registry of Diagnostic Medical Sonography.

Master of Science in Nursing (MSN)

A great way to continue your nursing education is with Bellin College's Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) program. The MSN program is fully accredited and prepares graduates with enhanced knowledge and practice expertise that builds and expands on baccalaureate nursing education. This preparation provides graduates with a broader understanding of nursing in order to engage in advanced practice, education and leadership in a variety of settings. Our program also emphasizes the importance of lifelong learning and provides a foundation for doctoral study.

Program Tracks:

The **Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP) track** is a 47-credit program designed to prepare graduates to function as licensed independent practitioners in primary care. Students complete courses that focus on the provision of the full spectrum of health care services across a lifespan. Students learn to use advanced health assessment skills, screening and diagnostic strategies, and prescriptive practices to manage the health/illness status of patients and families. Practicum experiences that total 680 hours are completed in a variety of primary care healthcare settings. Graduates are eligible to take American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC) and/or American Academy of Nurse Practitioners Certification Boards (AANPCB) family nurse practitioner certification exams.

The FNP track is available in full-time and part-time options and offers a combination of online, face-to-face, and hybrid classes that are delivered in a 15-week semester.

The **Nurse Educator (NE) track** is a 39-credit program designed to prepare graduates for the nurse educator

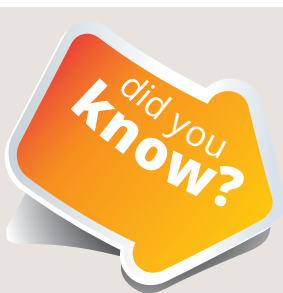
role across various academic and clinical settings. Students integrate core MSN coursework and education specialty courses that focus on evidence-based teaching and learning principles, curriculum development and evaluation, instructional design and technology, assessment of educational outcomes, and nurse educator role development. Students will integrate knowledge and skills into the educational and practice setting in a 255-hour practicum experience. Graduates are eligible to take the Certified Nurse Educator™ Exam after other criteria has been met.

The Nurse Educator (NE) track is available in full-time and part-time options, and classes are 100% online, delivered in a 15-week semester.

Post-graduate Certificate Programs

The **Family Nurse Practitioner Post-Graduate Certificate (FNP PGC) program** is available to registered nurses who have a Master of Science in Nursing or Doctor of Nursing Practice degree who desire to continue their education and expand their skillset as a Family Nurse Practitioner.

In the **Nurse Educator Post-Graduate Certificate (NE PGC) program**, students master the knowledge and skills required to competently serve in the nurse educator role. Coursework is online and focuses on curriculum design, teaching, evaluation and nurse educator role transition, and culminates in a 255-hour practicum. Graduates are eligible to take the Certified Nurse Educator™ Exam after other criteria are met.

- Send official high school transcripts including ACT scores
- Be sure to include official transcript(s) of all post-secondary (e.g. college/university) institutions attended. Transcripts must be sent directly to Bellin College Admissions Department by the college or university to be considered official.

New admissions programs for high school students:

The **Sophomore Transfer with Advanced Requirements (STAR) Pathway** is an innovative path for academically advanced high school students. Using a combination of Advanced Placement (AP) classes and college coursework, students can blaze a path that sets them up to graduate with a bachelor's degree in three years.

The Bellin College **Developing Academic Skills and Habits (DASH)** Program provides academic support to students who do not meet the admissions requirements for our direct admit option. The goal of the program is to help students achieve the standards needed to enroll in the Sophomore Transfer Option (STO) their second year. This option is available for the nursing and radiologic sciences programs.

Transfer Students:

General education courses from accredited two or four year institutions can be applied toward your degree. Students wishing to transfer to Bellin College must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 in transfer courses, and no grade lower than a "C" in required general education courses.

Travel & Service Learning

Misión El Faro - Guatemala

During winter interim, students have the opportunity to travel to Aldea Punta de Palma, Izabal in Guatemala. The group of 14 selected students will have course content during the fall semester which will increase their knowledge of the Guatemalan culture and the health issues that are found in the city and rural communities. The students will work alongside nurse practitioners and physicians to provide educational opportunities to the nursing staff within the Eliza Martinez Children's Hospital in the city of Puerto Barrios, to set up a clinic in the city dump of Puerto Barrios, and to deliver health care to three area villages.

Travel course to London

Undergraduate and graduate students will have the opportunity to travel to London during Spring Break to fulfill a social science requirement for undergraduate studies or as part of a scholarly project for graduate studies. Students will have the opportunity to visit sites, hospitals and learn how the National Health Service (NHS) operates in the United Kingdom. All visits will be escorted by a local nursing specialist guide.



Urban Immersion

The Urban Immersion program is an alternative break option in which students immerse themselves into an urban environment, exploring issues of social justice and social determinants of health.
