Are you thinking about a career in healthcare? Our Nursing Assistant program is a great way to start building your skills.

What is a nursing assistant?

Nursing assistants (NAs) are an essential member of a healthcare team, who work under the direct supervision of a nurse and perform basic duties such as dressing, bathing, feeding or transporting patients.

The Nursing Assistant Program at Bellin College is a State of Wisconsin approved nurse aide training program and is reviewed every two years by the Office of Caregiver Quality of the Division of Quality Assurance of the Wisconsin Department of Health Services.



Program Outcomes

- Communicate and interact effectively with clients, family and co-workers.
- Demonstrate the maintenance and protection of client rights.
- Report information and record observations accurately.
- Demonstrate the ethical and legal responsibilities of the NA.
- Provide safe care to a diverse population, meeting personal, physical and psychosocial needs of the resident.
- Assist with resident rehabilitation and restorative care, promoting independence.
- Assist residents with long-term, disabling conditions including dementia, always focusing on the strengths of the resident.
- Work cooperatively in a team environment.
- Eligible to take the Wisconsin Nursing Assistant Competence Evaluation.

Why choose Bellin College's NA program?

- Small class sizes
- Program cost is lower than other local programs
- The Department of Health Services is allowing supervised laboratory simulation to replace in-person clinical training during the pandemic. Students are still eligible to take the state certification exam.

Admission Requirements

All requirements for program entry must be completed prior to entry into the program.

- Students must be at least 16 years of age
- Documentation of immunization history
- Technical Standards Inventory (signed by parent/guardian for students under 18 years of age)
- Two-step TB testing

Clinical Requirements

• A caregiver background check will be completed after registration

Dates: Session 1: January 11 – February 10, 2021 or Session 2: February 15 – March 18, 2021

Cost: \$720 (includes book and supplies) Students are responsible for providing their own hospital scrubs and

payment for the State of Wisconsin certified testing.
