Graduate Nursing Update

Bellin College has had an accredited MSN program since 2004. Our current MSN program is for BSN-prepared nurses who want to expand their professional opportunities as a nurse educator or a family nurse practitioner. Our Nurse Educator (NE) program is offered completely online. The Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP) program is a mix of on campus and blended classes. Both programs have a three-year part-time and a two-year full-time option. Additionally, we offer nurse educator and family nurse practitioner certificate programs for MSN prepared nurses seeking additional knowledge and skills as an educator or a FNP.

This past spring, 18 FNP students graduated from the MSN program. Additionally, we graduated three students from the Post-Master's Certificate Program. We are extremely proud of our graduates. Congrat-

ulations to the MSN class of 2020!

This fall, we welcomed 37 new students into the MSN program (FNP, NE, and certificate). If you are a BSN student interested in advancing your education and would like to talk about your options, please

NEW! COVID-19 symptom reporting:

Students should email covidreporting@bellincollege.edu if they are having symptoms or potential/confirmed exposure to COVID-19. Please state when symptoms started and what they are; if applicable, state when exposure occurred, what it was, how long, and who (household member, friend, patient?) and if you were social distanced. Email as much detail as possible so staff will be able to guide you to your next steps.

Timing of getting tested for COVID-19 is critical to maximize accurate results.

- If symptomatic, the recommendation is being tested within the first 5 days of illness.
- If asymptomatic, exposed to a confirmed positive person, the recommendation is testing between days 4-6 from the initial exposure.

COVID-19 Testing Free for Bellin Students

The college received some funding to cover the costs of COVID-19 testing. We have set up a program with the Bellin Health System to get free COVID-19 tests for students. The information and steps are listed below. Dr. Burruss is coordinating the Student Testing. Please follow these steps to get a *FREE* test:

- 1. Create a MyBellinHealth account if you do not have one. You log into MyBellinHealth.org and sign up. (It is easy and free).
- 2. Email Emily Caelwaerts at emily.caelwaerts@bellincollege.edu the following information:
 - Your Full name
 - Date of birth
 - Preferred testing date and time
 - Emily will notify the Bellin Health testing team of your request. Please plan on going to the date and time you selected.
- 3. Go for your test at the assigned date and time at 600 Webster Ave., (verify location in case location has changed) near the hospital and the Manor Care Nursing Home. This is the drive-up testing site.
- 4. You will receive your results through your MyBellinHealth account.
- 5. You will need to notify Dr. Nancy Burruss, Dean of Student Services of your test results as she will provide the guidance and approval for your return to campus/clinical at nancy.burruss@bellincollege.edu

Please stay safe, take proper precautions, wear a mask, wash your hands, and practice social distancing.





All students must receive the flu vaccination. If you have not received the flu vaccine at one of our annual clinics, please schedule your flu shot as soon as possible at another location. Bellin Occupational Health, a pharmacy, or your primary care physician are some of the options. As per the policy at Bellin Health, you must be vaccinated and show proof by **Dec. 1**.

Flu shots are mandatory for all clinical sites and while on campus. If you have received the flu vaccination elsewhere, a signed declination form must be turned in to Emily Caelwaerts, Administrative Assistant, in Room 111. Students who fail to meet this deadline will be removed from the academic roster and will be subject to performance action.



Emergency Procedures & Campus Safety

Students should familiarize themselves with the Bellin College campus emergency evacuation plans posted throughout the building. During a fire drill, all students and employees are expected to vacate the building.

The college is equipped with emergency phones and call buttons. There are emergency phones in the parking lots, which can be identified by their blue lights. These phones access 911 emergency responses. There is also an emergency call button located in the campus wellness center. The college has a cardiac arrest mobile unit (AED or automated external defibrillator) located at the reception desk in the Atrium.

Campus safety: This is a shared responsibility between the college and its campus community members. There are security personnel on campus when students have access to the building. For assistance during regular business hours (8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.), contact the One Stop Shop. Security personnel will be patrolling the campus during nonbusiness hours, and will be stationed at the reception desk in the Atrium.

Inclement weather/class cancellations: If the hours of operation of the college are altered (cancellation of classes, labs, and/or practicum), there will be an announcement sent to all students via text message and email with the details of the delay/closure. The Bellin College website banner will also indicate the changes, and local radio and television stations may also be notified of delay/closure.



Bellin College Hours

General guidelines: Students may enter the main entrance door on the first floor or the back doors by using their ID badges. The college is open to the public from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. The main entrance door will be open during regular business hours. Students' ID badges will allow access before and after regular business hours.

Hours are subject to change, namely, during holidays and summer months. A complete list of campus hours are found in the Undergraduate Student Handbook.
