Undergraduate Programs

With more than 120 clinical partners, you will gain hands-on experience in a variety of areas in your field of study—ensuring that you will have the skills needed to be confident and successful in your career.

NURSING

Graduates of Bellin College serve as role models for professional nursing, community service, and lifelong learning. Our graduates are prepared to address the healthcare needs of a diverse, global society and its individuals, and are committed to advancing the professional practice of nursing.

• Bachelor of Science in Nursing program options:

- Three year traditional program
- Junior Transfer
- 15 Month

ALLIED HEALTH

(All programs are three years)

This segment of the health care field delivers services involving the identification, evaluation and prevention of diseases and disorders; dietary and nutrition services; and rehabilitation and health systems management.

• Bachelor of Science in Surgical Technology/ Surgical Assisting

Students will learn how to provide surgeons with the instruments and equipment necessary to perform surgery, how to assist the surgeon during the procedure and how to provide pre and post-operative care in the office setting.

This program is one of the first bachelor's degree programs in the country to combine surgical technology, first assistant and office practice training, which goes beyond traditional surgical technology programs.

Medical Imaging Programs

Medical imaging uses various technologies to diagnose, monitor or treat medical conditions. We offer several medical imaging programs at Bellin College with many clinical experience opportunities.

• Bachelor of Science in Diagnostic Medical Sonography

This program will introduce you to a variety of sonography (ultrasound) specialties. You will have the option to choose between two different tracks:

1. **General Vascular:** Abdominal, Obstetrics/Gynecology, and Vascular (*with the option to minor in adult echocardiography*)
2. **Cardiovascular:** Adult Cardiac, Pediatric Cardiac, and Vascular

• Bachelor of Science in Radiation Therapy

Become an essential member of any cancer care team. This program will include a full-time clinical internship during your final year. You will also have the opportunity to practice using our newest simulation technology to enhance your learning experience and provide the best patient care.

• Bachelor of Science in Radiologic Sciences

In this program, you will help diagnose injury and disease through the use of x-ray equipment and other technologies through two of the following specialties:

1. *CT Scanning (Computed Tomography)*
2. *MRI (Magnetic Resonance Imaging)*
3. *Women's Imaging (Mammography and DXA Scanning)*
4. *Bone Density Scanning (DXA)*

CERTIFICATE:

• Diagnostic Cardiac Sonography

Continue your sonography education with our Diagnostic Cardiac Sonography Certificate program (DCS). This two-semester program is a fast-track adult echocardiography program designed for working sonographers registered in vascular technology (RVT).

**This certificate is taught fully online with one mandatory in-person weekend clinical intensive requirement in the fall semester.*



EXCELLENCE

Applying to Undergraduate Programs

1. Complete the Bellin College Undergraduate Admission Application found at bellincollege.edu.
2. Send official high school transcripts.
3. Admissions counselors review all application materials in a holistic fashion. Focus is on the applicant and not GPA or ACT test scores.
4. Test Scores are Optional for admission.
5. Be sure to include official transcript(s) of all post-secondary (e.g. college/university) institutions attended and IB and AP score reports if applicable. Transcripts must be sent directly to Bellin College Admissions Department by the college or university to be considered official.

Admission Requirements for all programs:

- 3.0 cumulative GPA recommended.
 - The following high school units are required:
 - English (4)
 - Social Science (3)
 - Math (3)
 - Biology (1)
 - Chemistry (1)
 - Advanced Science (1)
- Algebra required*

Transfer Students:

General education courses from accredited two or four year institutions can be applied toward your degree. Students wishing to transfer to Bellin College must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 in transfer courses, and no grade lower than a "C" in required general education courses.

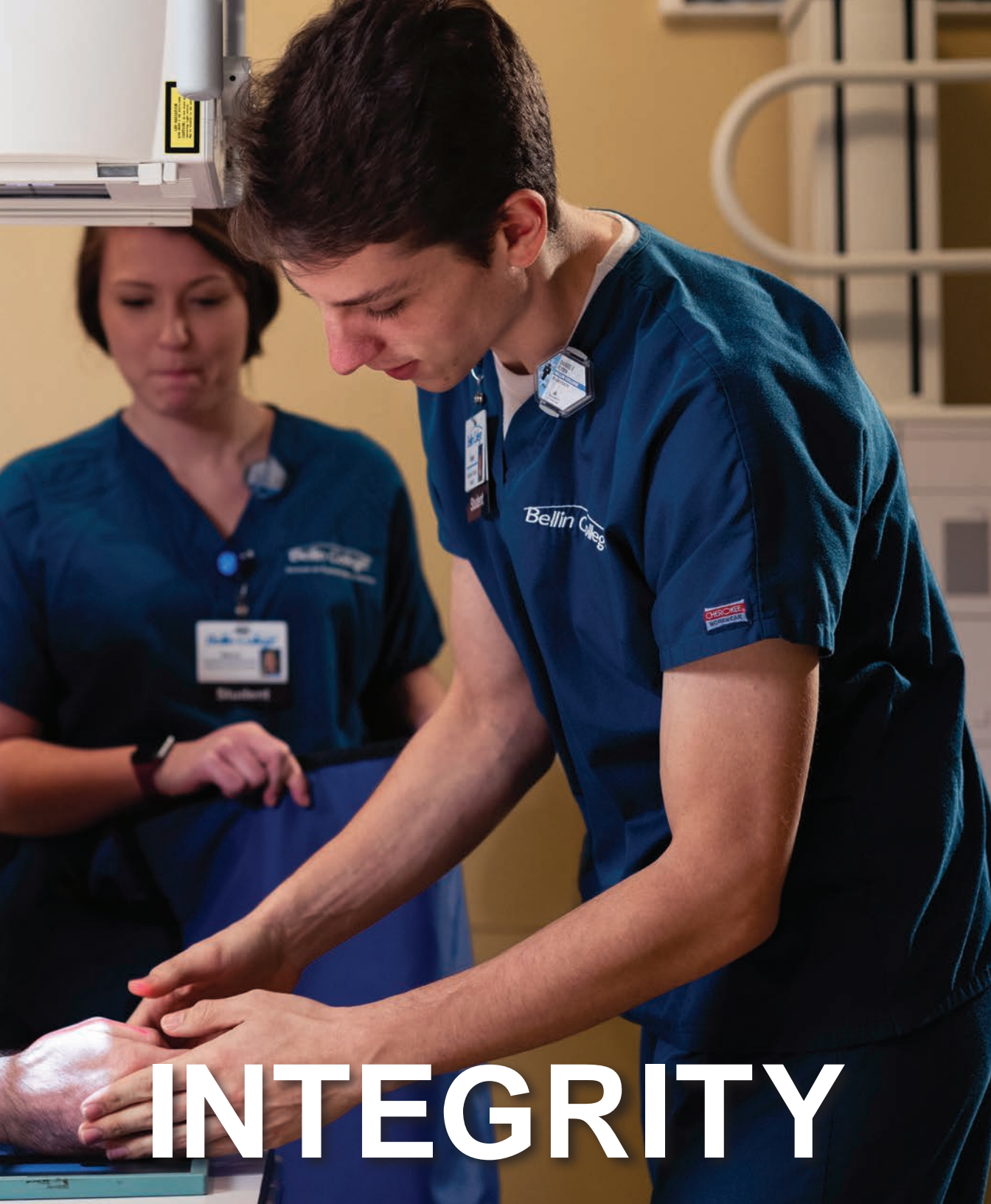

Financing your healthcare education

Financial Aid and Scholarships

Approximately 99% of Bellin College students receive financial aid.

No one should be deterred from applying to a college because of the price tag. The Financial Aid Office at Bellin College works with students and their families to help them meet educational expenses. We understand the importance of affordability. As a private college, we try our best to keep our costs as low as possible while still providing students with the quality of faculty, facilities and services our students expect and deserve.

Financial Aid

Financial aid is any money you receive to assist you and your family with financing your college education.

Students wishing to apply for financial assistance to attend Bellin College (BC) must complete and file a FAFSA each year of their program. The priority filing deadline for the FAFSA is December 1st of each year.

Scholarships

Each year we offer a variety of scholarships to students that exemplify the College values of Excellence, Integrity, Community, and Caring. The funds come from multiple sources and do not have to be repaid.
