NURSING

Extensive clinical experience, the opportunity to learn multiple specialties, and an emphasis on leadership will allow you to be more confident and marketable in your nursing career.

Nurses are responsible for the delivery of effective, high-quality patient care in collaboration with other healthcare professionals. Graduates of Bellin College serve as role models for professional nursing, community service, and lifelong learning. ALLIED HEALTH

This segment of the healthcare field delivers services involving the identification, evaluation and prevention of diseases and disorders; dietary and nutrition services; and rehabilitation and health systems management.

• Bachelor of Science in Radiation Therapy

Become an essential member of any cancer care team. This program includes a full-time clinical internship during your final year. You will also have the opportunity to practice using our newest simulation technology to enhance your learning experience and provide the best patient care.

Bachelor of Science in Surgical Assisting

Students will learn how to provide surgeons with the instruments and equipment necessary to perform surgery, how to assist the surgeon during the procedure and how to provide pre and post-operative care in the office setting.

This program is one of the first bachelor's degree programs in the country to combine surgical technology, first assistant and office practice training, which goes beyond traditional surgical technology programs.

Medical Imaging Programs

Medical imaging uses various technologies to diagnose, monitor or treat medical conditions. We offer several medical imaging programs at Bellin College with many clinical experience opportunities.

• Bachelor of Science in Diagnostic Medical Sonography

This program will introduce you to a variety of sonography (ultrasound) specialties. You will have the option to choose between two different tracks:

- 1. General Vascular: Abdominal, Obstetrics/Gynecology, and Vascular (with the option to minor in adult echocardiography)
- 2. Cardiovascular: Adult Cardiac, Pediatric Cardiac, and Vascular

Bachelor of Science in Radiologic Sciences

In this program, you will help diagnose injury and disease through the use of x-ray equipment and other technologies through two of the following specialties:

- CT Scanning (Computed Tomography)
- MRI (Magnetic Resonance Imaging)
- Women's Imaging (Mammography)
- Bone Density Scanning (DXA)

Continue your sonography education!

Continue your sonography education with our Diagnostic Cardiac Sonography Certificate program (DCS). This two-semester program is a fast-track adult echocardiography program designed for working sonographers registered in vascular technology (RVT).

*This certificate is taught fully online with one mandatory in-person weekend clinical intensive requirement in the fall semester.

Admission Requirements for all programs:

- The following high school units are required:

 - Social Science (3)
 - Math (3) Algebra required
- Biology (1)
- Chemistry (1)
- Advanced Science (1)

Transfer Students:

General education courses from accredited two or four-year institutions can be applied toward your degree. Students wishing to transfer to Bellin College must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 in transfer courses, and no grade lower than a "C" in required general education courses.

FYE First-Year Experience

Bellin College First-Year Experience (FYE) program is designed to help students succeed and foster a sense of belonging.

This comprehensive experience begins during Students Connecting, Registering, and Uniting at Bellin College (SCRUB) Days in June and July. Then, first-year students arrive the weekend before classes in late August for a Week of Welcome to kick off the start of the academic year. Activities begin at a nearby camp, where first-year students have the opportunity to become more familiar with the college, meet their mentors, and get to know their fellow classmates.

The program also introduces a few of the social and extra-curricular activities Bellin College offers.

Students are then enrolled in Student Success 100. This course is designed to help students learn and improve skills and strategies that are essential to academic success. Topics include professionalism, time management, study skills, note-taking, test-taking strategies, stress management, and reading strategies, among others.

Bellin College B-SET Program

The Bellin Students Empowered Together (B-SET) program is an experience for multicultural college students coming to Bellin College. Students who participate in the B-SET program will have the opportunity to establish meaningful and supportive relationships with faculty, staff, and peers, become more familiar with campus resources and policies, develop valuable skills for college success, foster leadership skills, and create long-lasting friendships.

Students who participate in the program will attend a FREE two-day program before classes start. Students will participate in meetings that address topics such as academic advising, diversity, equity, inclusion, financial aid, study tips, etc. The program will also introduce a resource for all multicultural college students called the Black, Indigenous, Students of College (BIPOC) Student Union.

Our goal is for all students to B-SET for college by having the proper resources and tools to help foster college success.

MENTAL HEALTH &WELLBEING

At Bellin College, we understand situations can arise that may impact your academic and personal life. For this reason, we ensure that students have the resources to be successful and take care of themselves. StudentLife is a free resource for you to use during your time of need. StudentLife offers resources such as:

- Telephone and Face-to-Face assistance for mental well-being, family concerns, or substance abuse
- Financial and legal consultation
- Child or elder care resources

- Veterinarians, pet sitting, and obedience training

Another initiative the college has developed is a Community Action Resource Evaluation (CARE) Team. This team meets multiple times per week to ensure that Bellin College is caring for the whole student. Students, faculty, and staff have the opportunity to fill out a confidential form online that gets sent to the CARE Team to ensure that students are receiving the resources they need.

The college wants students to put their needs first. This includes exercising. Bellin College has a wellness center on campus and also has a partnership with the YMCA.
